### Letters from Leah

The story goes that in November 1939 WH Auden went to the movies in New York City, his new home. Auden had emigrated to the US from Britain, escaping both the comparisons to TS Eliot in his professional life and complications of being a Vicar's-grandson-turned-atheist in his personal life. He left England and the Anglican Church altogether. Sitting in that theater, though, Auden had an epiphany.

The theater, one that catered to German clientele, where Auden felt quite at home having lived in Germany for some time, was showing a German newsreel. News of what had been happening in Europe was well known and Auden had been writing about it. In fact, his most famous poem, "September 1, 1939," had already been published weeks prior. In the movie house that day, when footage of the Nazis invading Poland appeared larger than life on the screen, the theater erupted in shouts of "Kill the Poles!" Auden couldn't quite make sense of it. These people, German immigrants living a whole world away from the turmoil brewing in Europe, we're under no obligation to support the Nazis. They did not live under threat and suppression as did their family back home. Years later, Auden would say, "I wondered, then, why I reacted as I did against this denial of every humanistic value. The answer brought me back to the church."

For Auden religion, and church going in general, wasn't so much about "formal institutions, supernatural beliefs, ancestral identities, moral prohibitions, doctrinal orthodoxies, sectarian arguments, religious emotions, spiritual aspirations, scriptural authority, or any other conventional aspect of personal or organized religion," as author Edward Mendelsohn reminds us, but about a way through this life. The practice of Christianity, with its commandant to love above all else helped Auden regain his humanity, continually, in an inhumane time.

Perhaps religion, and church going in general, can be the same for us.

Here's a poem for Epiphany:

The Three Wise Men by W.H. Auden

The weather has been awful,  
The countryside is dreary,  
Marsh, jungle, rock; and echoes mock,  
Calling our hope unlawful;  
But a silly song can help along  
Yours ever and sincerely:  
At least we know for certain that we are three old sinners,  
That this journey is much too long, that we want our dinners,  
And miss our wives, our books, our dogs,

**someone to bring up the ladders from downstairs prior to 4:00.**



## Worship for the Epiphany Season

Happy New Year! Here's what you have to look forward to in Worship in the coming weeks:

**January 1** is the second Sunday in the Christmas season. This worship service features Christmas poems and all the carols you want to sing just one more time before we pack them away another year.

**January 8** is Epiphany Sunday. As is our tradition at Community, we will come forward to receive a star word, our gift from the manager and our watch word for 2023.



**January 15** is baptism of Christ Sunday. We will celebrate the sacrament of baptism and remember our own baptisms on this day. Would you like to be baptized? Please contact Pastor Leah if you are interested.

**January 22** brings the beginning of a new series: To Be Human. The title echoes the last line of the WH Auden poem quoted in this month's Letter from Leah. This series invites us to find our humanness amid the inhumanity of our world through "the Human one" (aka "the Son of Man" -- Jesus the Christ). We begin with Matthew 4:12-23, Walk in the Light.

**January 29**, Annual Meeting Sunday, gives us a chance to consider what it means to be blessed in Jesus' estimation. We will look at Matthew 5:1-12.

**February 5** allows us to look at what it means to keep the Commandments via the metaphors of salt and light in Matthew 5:13-20.

**February 12** brings a complicated reading: Matthew 5:21-37. On this day, we'll look past surface interpretations to see what Jesus might be attempting to get us to understand about right relation.

**February 19** is Transfiguration Sunday we will look at Matthew 17:1-9.

**Wednesday, February 22nd** is Ash Wednesday and the beginning of the Lenten Season. Look for more information about Ash Wednesday and the season that will lead us to Easter in next month's newsletter.

Guest speaker Matthias Roberts.



Campus Ministry is excited to welcome Matthias Roberts to be our QF 6 speaker! Queering Faith 6 will be held in the main sanctuary February 10th at 6:00. Matthias is an author, therapist and speaker who specializes in "gender, sexuality, mental health, and theology." Because of CUCC's focus this year on OWL and mental health, this seems like a perfect fit to bring the conversation forward to our college age (and community) folks. He will be speaking to us about shame, sexuality, mental health, and theology and how all that can get tangled in the first place, but most importantly, how to untangle it! For anyone who has felt deep issues with shame attached to sexuality, this is for you!

From his bio: **Matthias Roberts** (he/him) is a queer psychotherapist, podcaster, and author of [\*Beyond Shame: Creating a Healthy Sex Life on Your Own Terms\*](#) (Fortress/Broadleaf, 2020.) He hosts [\*Queerology: A Podcast on Belief and Being\*](#) and co-hosts *Selfie* alongside fellow therapist Kristen Howerton. Matthias holds two master's degrees, one in Theology & Culture and one in Counseling Psychology from The Seattle School of Theology and Psychology.

Matthias' work has been featured by *O: The Oprah Magazine*, *Bustle*, *Woman's Day*, *Sojourners*, *The Seattle Times*, and many others. He is a Fellow at the [Allender Center](#), a nonprofit helping survivors of trauma and abuse heal by stepping courageously into their stories of pain and harm. In his psychotherapy practice, Matthias specializes in helping LGBTQ+ people recover from religious and spiritual trauma so they might live confident and fulfilling lives.

Matthias writes and speaks nationwide about the intersections between gender, sexuality, mental health, and theology. His newest book, *Holy Runaways* will be released in Fall 2023.

Merry Christmas from Jubilee Cafe CUCC ! Tonight we served a chouce of Christmas Ham (donated by two of our student guests last week), or vegetarian ham, with greens plus creamy, cheesy potatoes. Guests had their choice of German Chocolate Cake, Cherry Pie, or housemade Egg Nog Bread Pudding with a Cranberry Pear Sauce. We served 52 meat, 48 vegetarian, and a variety of heat at home meals, 24 in all. Every guest took home a box of Christmas Cookies.

Fellowship Hall is decked out for the season. We had music playing at the beginning and end of the night, and then, CUCCers caroled for our guests in the middle.

While helping a guest stuff a new blanket into a trash bag to take with him later in the evening, I noticed he was singing along with our Carolers. So were all of the men at his table, not loudly, just under their breath, "....and wonders of His love, And wonders of His love, And wo-onders, wo-o-onders of His love."

Later, that same guest rushed over to me with such a panic in his eye I thought something was wrong. Excitedly, he pointed at the carol singers. "Are they going to eat?"

"Maybe," I said, "mostly they've come to sing for you." "That's awful sweet of them. But they should eat too!" he insisted.

The kindness and generosity of our guests bowls me over. So often people expect folks like our guests to act a certain way....nit so kind, so very generous. That assumption is just not true. The generosity of Jubilee flows both ways -- from volunteers to guest, and guests back to us.

Friends, we won't be open next Monday. We will reopen on Monday, January 2. We pray that you will have a merry, merry Christmas. Pray that our guests will as well. See you in the New Year.

### Alternative Advent Market Update

Because of you, we were able to provide \$1265 worth of needed supplies to our local partner organizations! You donated:

- 4 packs of Uno cards, 3 packages of ChapStick, 4 water bottles, and 7 pairs of slide sandals for the unaccompanied migrant youth as they live in the Caminos program while awaiting placement with family or foster families here in the US.
- 11 pairs of long underwear, a package of hand warmers, and 6 pairs of warm substantial gloves to be given to our neighbors without permanent addresses through Canteen Run, and...
- 8 weighted blankets, \$220 worth of gift cards to local restaurants, and \$280 worth of gas cards to be given as part of care packages by Trauma & Resilience Initiative/Bend the Arc to those affected by gun violence in the Champaign-Urbana area.
