Letters from Leah

People participate in church for different reasons. Some come to worship because they have a deep devotion to God, or out of a need to connect to Something Bigger Than Me. Others participate in acts of service with a church community because they are committed to bettering the world in which they live – reasons for that commitment vary. Some come seeking connection, friendship, and companionship. Some come seeking meaning and purpose, or challenge and personal growth. Still, others participate out of a sense of tradition. For some people, it's a combination of the above. And still, for others, it's a different reason entirely, one that is deeply personal. There is no right or wrong answer here. People participate in church for lots of reasons and all of those reasons are valid. The good news is that at Community United Church of Christ, no matter why a person would choose to participate in our church, they would be welcome. We understand that church participation is not just plopping down in a pew on Sunday morning. It is participating remotely in worship. It is participating in acts of service, being part of a fellowship or study group. It is all of these things and more.

In a post-pandemic world, what it means to be part of a church will continue to diversify. Studies show that in-person attendance has ticked down since March of 2020, you can read more here: <https://www.pewresearch.org/religion/2023/03/28/how-the-pandemic-has-affected-attendance-at-u-s-religious-services/> The study also cites generational data which is important and also needs to be taken in context. Every few years, church leaders have their Chicken Little moment, running around declaring that the sky is falling in terms of who is coming to church and not coming to church. While it is true that all the studies in the link above affirm that people aged 18 to 29 are less likely to participate in church than those in older age brackets, what is also true is that people of all ages look for meaning, connection, and purpose in their lives. Everyone needs friendship and companionship. Most folks will tell you that they do indeed want the world to be a better place and that they believe in Something Bigger Than They Are. Most people call that thing God.

The world has changed. What people need in their lives has both changed and remained the same. As a church, we have adapted, and continue to adapt, accordingly. People need places like Community United Church of Christ. Let's make sure the people who need us can find us.

Church, we need to be intentional about outreach. Let's be deliberate about inviting people to check us out. I'm so impressed every Sunday when I get home and realize how many of you have checked into worship on social media. Keep it up! And remember this: People are far more likely to visit a church when they are invited to do so by someone they know. Someone may come to church or an activity of the church because they see a social media post. The odds are even better when they receive a personal invitation. We have all of the reasons why someone might choose to participate in a church available, and more.

It's a good time to invite people to worship. This summer, we're looking at The Gospel According to Oz – a worship series exploring the themes of The Wizard of Oz Universe. Each Sunday will feature special music, video clips, liturgy, and our own field of poppies and yellow brick road. Share this schedule with friends:

June 4 – Our series kicks off with Somewhere Over the Rainbow. We'll explore what it means to have the power to be at home all along, or as Jesus puts it, to know that the "kin-dom of God is among you."

June 11 – IT'S PACK A PEW SUNDAY! We'll pair selections from Esther with this aspect of this heroes' journey: each character thinks they lack and yet come to discover that they were "born for such a time as this."

June 18 – We shift to the 1970s reinterpretation, The Wiz, and Dorothy's song, "Home," and explore the vision of God's promise for us.

June 25 – Continuing with The Wiz, we'll be reminded through the song "Ease on Down the Road" that, when we journey together in Christ, our "burden is easy."

July 2 – On this holiday weekend, we'll take a break from our worship series with a hymn sing and special readings.

July 9 – This Sunday shifts us again, this time to Wicked. Today, we'll listen to the song "For Good" and consider how our relationships, regardless of their tone, change us. Our sacred stories are full of so many complicated relationship stories. We'll look at a few of them on this day.

July 16 – The song "Popular" invites us to consider a common misinterpretation of the Great Commission – did Jesus really call us to make-over the less fortunate?

July 23 – The finale of this series asks, "Have You Seen a Brand New Day?" – what does it mean to be a resurrection people.

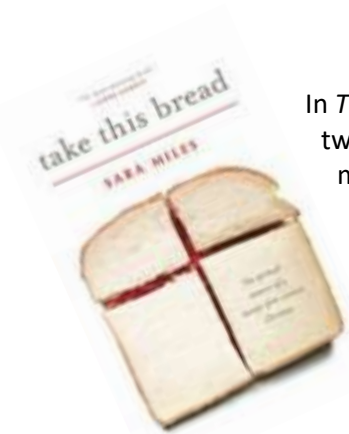
News from the John Bandy Center

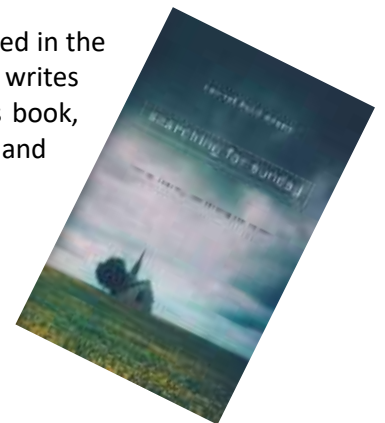

We have just begun reading *All That Is Made* from the Alabaster Company, a meditation on the creative life, spirituality and faith. Even if photography is not "your thing" but you are interested in reading and talking about this book with us, please come join us! Did you know that the John Bandy Center for Spirituality and Faith has all kinds of books and other materials available for check out? This month, we highlight two memoirs.



In *Take This Bread*, Sara Miles recounts how she moved from her upbringing as an atheist to becoming "a twenty-first-century Christian." Despite some misgivings, Miles volunteered to help with a feeding ministry at a church in her community. Much to her surprise, she found herself accepted in spite of her lack of faith. As she becomes more immersed in the work, she also finds herself being attracted to the church, its people and the faith it lives in its day-to-day interactions with its community. And then, one day, something mysterious happens during the Eucharist....

Before her untimely death in 2019, Rachel Held Evans spoke for a generation who had been raised in the church and grown disillusioned with what they had experienced. In *Searching for Sunday*, she writes about her search for a faith and a spiritual home among today's expressions of faith. Of this book, Glennon Doyle Melton wrote, "*Searching for Sunday* helped me forgive the church and myself and fall in love with God all over again."

May 1, 2023: "I like this," our guest said, motioning to the dining room. He began eating with us during the pandemic, back when we were serving dinner out the front door, and kept coming when we moved back inside. This guest is older, old enough to be my father if not my grandfather, and English is a second language. We continue our conversation. "You do?" I ask. I'm always interested to hear what our guests like and do not like about what we do here at Jubilee Cafe CUCC. "I do. I like this...." he says, searching for the right word. He motions again, in a broad sweeping gesture, like he's waving to the entire room. "This feels like....," he trails off and pauses -- I am acutely aware of how utterly stumped I would be if I lived someplace where English was not the language everyone spoke. "This feels like family."

When we gather in our volunteer circle before each dinner service, we often articulate the hope that all our guests feel loved and cherished, like they matter and belong, and our hopes came true tonight. This guest feels that way. I didn't know. I'm so glad he told me. I'm grateful to get to pass the story along to you. In a world where it's so easy to feel separate and isolated, alone and lonely, to feel connected, like you are part of something, is good news. More than that, it's Good News. This is the kind of community Jesus calls us to, to create, nourish, strengthen, and grow. This is the kind of community that redeems, sustains, and saves. This is the kind of community that creates the world we want.

Tonight we served a Southwestern lasagna: layers of beans, cheese, corn, salsa, and protein, nestled between tortillas. Each entree was served with mixed vegetables plus a side of guacamole and chips. Guests had their choice of tres leches cake or chocolate cake for dessert. In total, we served 118 hot meals.

We will have most of our student volunteers leaving soon. Check out the sign up genius and come volunteer with us this summer!

Worship Ministry



Get Involved in Worship

Liturgy is defined as the work of the people, the community gathered for worship. This is one of the reasons Liturgists, Greeters, Ushers, the Choir, and others participate in the leadership of worship. Worship is not just the pastor's role. Many voices add richness to the worship experience for all.

To simplify volunteering for opportunities to serve in worship at CUCC, the Sign-up Genius for Liturgists, Ushers, and Greeters has been updated into one sign up sheet. Sign up where all three worship assistant tasks are listed for each worship service through June.

The paper sign-up sheets have also been consolidated into a single sign-up sheet requiring a simple check mark in the appropriate task box to indicate which task you are volunteering for (liturgist, usher, greeter) for that day.

We hope this will make it easier to volunteer to serve in worship at CUCC.



Liturgist: The liturgist leads portions of the worship service including reading the scripture lesson. All information is sent ahead of time so there is time to practice before the worship service.

Usher: The usher welcomes folks into the sanctuary and hands them a bulletin for the service. They also pass the offering plate at offering time, count and record the physical number of people attending the worship service. Directions are provided in a weekly email.



Greeters: Welcome folks to Community United Church of Christ, especially visitors, and help them find their way around the building to the restrooms, the fellowship hour, and the sanctuary. Greeters make all people coming to CUCC feel welcomed. Reminders of service are provided in a weekly email.
