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Letters from Leah

Our front yard is a little scary looking. Normally, at this point in the summer, it is full of daisies, a field of snow-white petals with sunny yellow centers. It's delightful. This year, with the drought and daisies in full sun all day, every day, they have dried up, leaving dozens of skeletal stems where verdant ones once were. The night before our make-up picnic in the Quad, there was a slim chance it would storm. I prayed for rain.

It rained north of us. It rained south of us. I keep tabs on the weather down at home and up at the lake. It has rained so much up at the lake that I'm sure the lake temp has dropped with the influx of new rainwater. Likewise, it rained so much down home that Holiday World implemented its rainy-day policy, giving park goers a free ticket to come back another day.

It is raining. It's just not raining here. "It feels personal," David said.

This got me thinking about our relationships with God. Sometimes, it seems as if God is everywhere, showering us with nurture and love. We grow and grow and grow. We may be facing challenges, but we are deeply rooted and branching out all at the same time. It's glorious. But there are other times when we find ourselves in a spiritual drought. God is nowhere to be seen and not on the horizon at all....at least, not our horizon. God IS seemingly on others' horizons, which feels, let's be honest, not great. Trouble is, we're ALREADY feeling not great because we're in a Divine dry spell. Looking around and seeing that others are well watered feels, well, like David said: personal.

Know this: it's not personal. The weather isn't withholding, and neither is God. The weather's not playing favorites, and neither is God.

We have a tiny herb garden on our front porch. It stretches down our front steps and onto the sidewalk in front of our house. It is doing quite well. I'll be able to make several batches of pesto and dry bundles of sage to use in the fall. But know this, it is only doing well because we water it regularly. We're not watering our lawn, nor the daisies. When we find ourselves in a spiritual drought, we have to make choices about what we water and what we do not, spiritually speaking. If it is already a struggle, do not expend your energy across-the-board. Be strategic and specific. But by all means, do water something! Come to worship, pick up your daily gratitude practice, be mindful of what you are reading or listening to. Give yourself limits around social media. Hydrating our hearts and minds will make a perceivable difference, but if it is spread too thin, everything will suffer. Just look at my lawn and our herb garden. It is pretty easy to tell what we're paying attention to and what we are not.

What are you paying attention to in this season? And what have you let go of? As you think about these things, just know this, I have checked the weather and it's going to rain again soon. I pray that is true in your life too.

PS Keep praying for rain, please. Our farmers need it. The land needs it. We all need it.

And while we couldn't solve all the problems for them, we could give them a delicious meal, a cool place to sit for a while, and plenty of people who were glad they came. The server also found out that they needed a backpack, and while I didn't have a backpack, I do have 80 billion tote bags from every conference I've ever attended, so I ran upstairs and found one for them. It'll do in a pinch. It's so hot tonight, so we had bottles of water for our guests without a permanent address to take on their way out. Most folks did, with a smile. I hope everyone has a cool place to stay this evening.

This evening we served 48 walnut lentil Bolognese dishes over pasta with a side of green beans and carrots plus garlic bread. We had enough free option for people with an allergy. Our dessert options included Key lime pie, chocolate cake, cheesecake with a house made berry sauce and fresh strawberries. And you know it's a good night at Jubilee when we have milk. We had milk!

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Mission Ministry

School Supplies and Sewers Needed



Far too soon it will be time to go back to school. We are continuing our annual project with Church World Services to complete bags of school supplies to send to those in need. As with previous years, **ONLY BUY THINGS FROM THIS LIST**. This helps with shipping, as well as making sure all kids receive the same much needed supplies. Keep your eyes open, as we will soon have a bin available to collect the school supplies.

- One pair of blunt scissors (Rounded tip only. Remove from packaging.)
- Three 70-count bound notebooks or notebooks totaling 200-210 pages (No loose-leaf or filler paper.)
- One 30-centimeter, 12" ruler
- One hand-held pencil sharpener (Remove from packaging.)
- One large eraser (No pencil cap erasers.)
- Six new, unsharpened pencils with erasers (Remove from packaging and use a rubber band to hold the pencils together.)
- Crayons - 24 pack

We will be planning a sewing/ironing/bag-making Sunday after church sometime this summer (jobs for non-sewers and sewers alike!). Please feel free to utilize the pattern below if you would like to make any bags on your own. In August (or early September), we will have our Sunday School assemble the bags with supplies.



SCHOOL BAG INSTRUCTIONS

MATERIALS NEEDED:

1/2 yd of "child-friendly" fabric 45" wide

Sewing machine and thread (or needle and thread if you prefer to sew by hand)

Sewing pins

Iron and ironing board

MAKE THE BAG:

1. Place the 13" x 17" pieces with right sides together; pin and sew 1/2-inch seam on three sides, leaving one 13" side open to be the top of the bag.
2. Fold the top 1/2 inch of the open side down; pin and press with an iron.
3. Then fold down another 2" at the top edge to form a hem; pin and stitch near the pressed edge. This will hide the raw edge and give the bag a sturdy, neat top edge.
4. Turn the bag right side out with the seams on the inside.

MAKE THE HANDLES:

1. Fold one of the 4" X 22" strips in half lengthwise with right sides together. Pin and then stitch the long sides together with a 1/2" seam; then turn the strip right side out. OR turn under 1/2 inch on the long sides of one strip and press. Fold strip with right side out. Top stitch pressed edges together close to edge. Either way, you will have a finished 22" long strip that is 1 1/2" wide.
2. Repeat for the second handle. Press. Now you have two finished handles.

ATTACH THE HANDLES TO THE BAG

Turn the short raw ends of the handles inside themselves about 1/2 inch to hide the raw edges.

Press. Then stitch the handles to the finished edge on the top of the bag.

The finished bag will be approximately 12" X 14".

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Worship Ministry



Get Involved in Worship

Liturgy is defined as the work of the people, the community gathered for worship. This is one of the reasons Liturgists, Greeters, Ushers, the Choir, and others participate in the leadership of worship. Worship is not just the pastor's role. Many voices add richness to the worship experience for all.

To simplify volunteering for opportunities to serve in worship at CUCC, the Sign-up Genius for Liturgists, Ushers, and Greeters has been updated into one sign up sheet. Sign up where all three worship assistant tasks are listed for each worship service through August.

The paper sign-up sheets have also been consolidated into a single sign-up sheet requiring a simple check mark in the appropriate task box to indicate which task you are volunteering for (liturgist, usher, greeter) for that day. We hope this will make it easier to volunteer to serve in worship at CUCC.



Liturgist: The liturgist leads portions of the worship service including reading the scripture lesson. All information is sent ahead of time so there is time to practice before the worship service.

Usher: The usher welcomes folks into the sanctuary and hands them a bulletin for the service. They also pass the offering plate at offering time, count and record the physical number of people attending the worship service. Directions are provided in a weekly email.



Greeters: Welcome folks to Community United Church of Christ, especially visitors, and help them find their way around the building to the restrooms, the fellowship hour, and the sanctuary. Greeters make all people coming to CUCC feel welcomed. Reminders of service are provided in a weekly email.
